Entry Requirements

Students must successfully complete a Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LNN) assessment and suitability interviews to secure their enrolment. Applicants seeking enrolment in a Blended Mode study option must show evidence of current employment in an approved Early Childhood Education & Care setting. Current and valid Provide First Aid certificate, Department of Communities & Social Inclusion (DCSI) Screening Check for working with children, & Physical Fitness are required for this program. Also Child safe Environments Training, Responding to Abuse and Neglect-Education and Care (RAN-EC) certificate mandatory to undertake student placement. If you do not hold a current DCSI check, you are required to apply through DCSI at the time of application for enrolment. Visit https://www.dcsiscreening.sa.gov.au/ for further information. Please note that the outcome of your DCSI screening check may affect industry placement opportunities, and that this is at the discretion of placement host facilities

Blended Mode

This program is delivered using a blended learning mode. Students attend regular on-campus sessions each month, supported by self-paced online learning. Each learner has a dedicated Educator to provide support through their learning journey.

You will still be required to complete assessments within the agreed time frames, requiring you to manage your workload around your lifestyle and commitments.

Industry Experience

Certificate III includes a minimum of 200 hours and the Diploma 320 hours of industry placement within an approved Early Childhood Education and Care centre.

It is a condition of the course that students undertake industry placement. This is generally completed full time in addition to campus learning commitments. If you are already working in a registered and approved child care centre, you are able to undertake your industry experience within your workplace.
